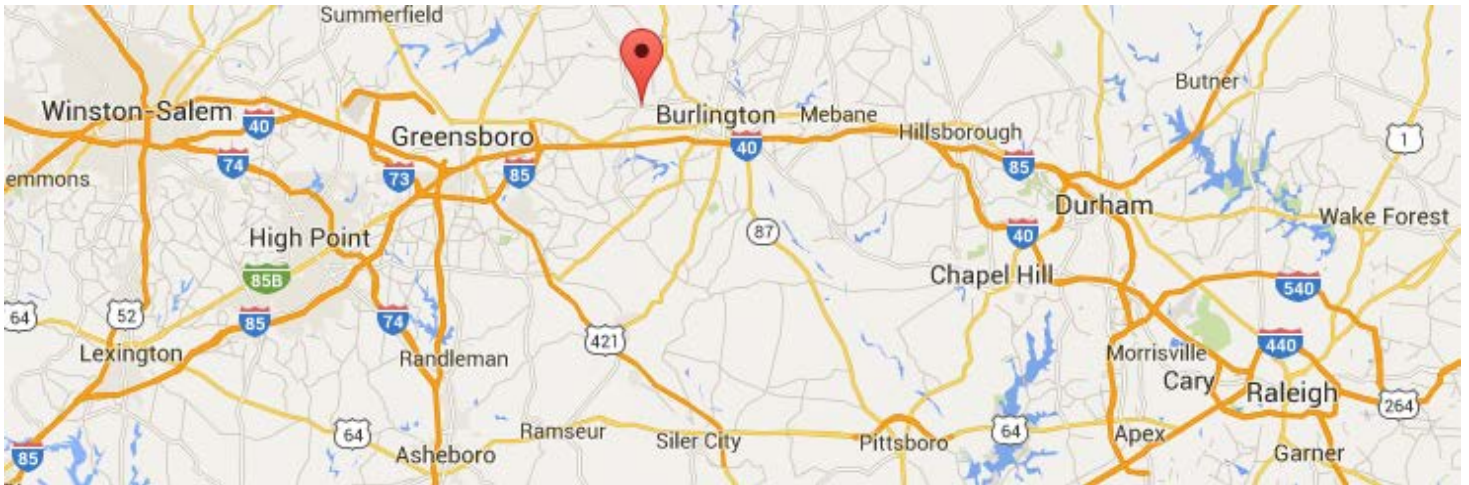

Central Locale Between Raleigh-Durham and Greensboro-Triad Metros: Located within a thirty minute drive of 409,082 persons, our split county location puts us literally at the door step of two dynamic markets.

Infrastructure: Continued growth is assured due to Gibsonville's easy access to the combined I-40 / I-85 thoroughfare (119,000+ VPD / day per NC DOT 2015 traffic counts), two (2) international airports (Raleigh Durham / RDU & Piedmont Triad International / PTIA), and the NC Railroad (passenger and freight).

Quality of Life: Our inviting, historic community has genuine quality of life. 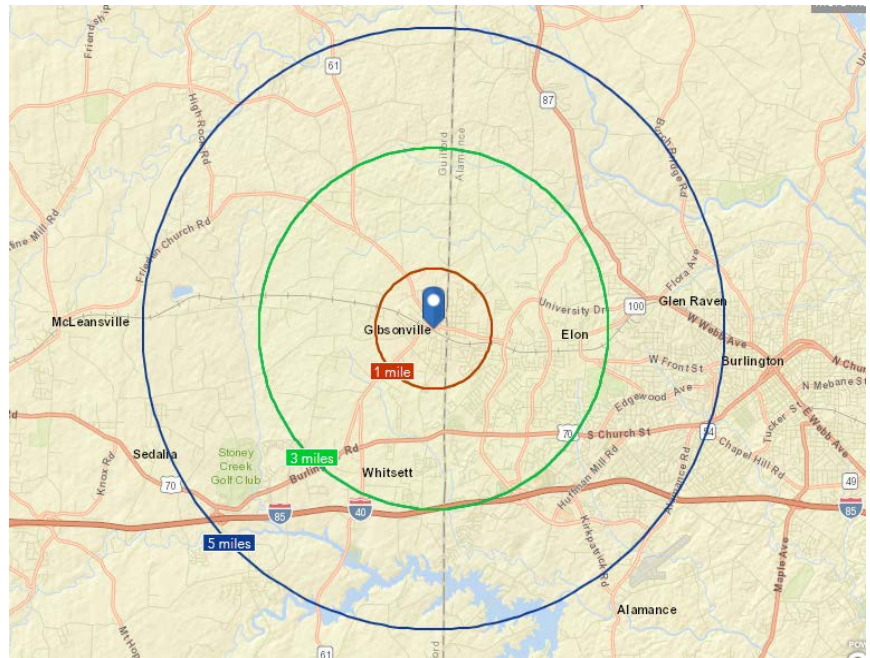
